

Mark Herzog, currently at Wetlands Ecology Division of the Point Reyes Bird Observatory (PRBO) received his doctorate in 2001 at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. His dissertation related to Black Brant goslings on the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta in Alaska. Morro Bay supports the largest overwintering population of Brant in southern California. In his presentation, "The Alaska - Morro Bay Connection," Herzog will share his fascinating experiences banding Brant goslings on their breeding ground in Alaska. He will offer a rare glimpse into one of the wildest and richest wildlife habitats in the world and show how it connects with the migration of the Brant to Morro Bay.


